This is a special long overdue welcome home to all the Vietnam Veterans. It will be May 20- 24, 2010. On Friday May 21st there will be a motorcycle ride from Lacrosse to Green Bay. There will be pick-up points along the route still to be announced. The last point is Timber rattler stadium. From there to Green Bay we will be escorted by a Huey. On Saturday May 22nd there will be exhibits in the Lambeau atrium and parking lots. These include Wisconsin Veteran Museum exhibits, back in the world portrait exhibit and others. There will also be book signings of Vietnam War stories book. Saturday night includes a celebration in the football bowl (tickets required). The program will include a Memorial ceremony for our fallen comrades, special speakers, music, premier screening of Wisconsin Vietnam War Stories clips. On Sunday May 23rd all exhibits in Lambeau field Atrium and the parking lots will be open. On Monday May 24th the Vietnam Moving Wall will have closing ceremonies.
